#### SPIT EA APPROVED BY THE PROVINCE

Much gained toward protecting the Public Urban Wilderness. However, several challenges remain.


Despite the many thoughtful letters from you and supporting groups and individuals objecting to the continuance of Aquatic Park Sailing Club – and its car access – the Minister of Environment approved the Environmental Assessment as submitted by the Metro Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (MTRCA).

We are greatly pleased with the general direction of the MTRCA plan for the Spit. However, we deeply regret that the environmental authorities failed to understand how critical it is for the future of the Spit to prevent the establishment of a privatizing use.

So if you thought that the approval of the EA ends nearly 15 years of lobbying and hard work to protect the Spit, we are sorry to say that this is not so.

New challenges are already mounting, such as Aquatic Park Sailing Club plans to build new (upscale?) clubhouse facilities, clamouring for more car access and demanding more amenities; waterfront development; and the expansion of Toronto Island Airport. In fact, Friends will need to be stronger than ever.

In the next issue of the Newsletter, we will discuss these issues at length.



## JETS, AIRPORT EXPANSION WOULD DEGRADE WATERFRONT ENJOYMENT

Jets zooming overhead every few minutes can certainly spoil your quiet time on the Spit! But that's what may well be in store if pro-development politicians dominate City Council. The tripartite agreement, which bans jets at the Toronto Island Airport (and therefore precludes expansion) once again will be in danger of being reopened.

Friends of the Spit strongly oppose airport expansion. It will bring noise and pollution. It will adversely affect the enjoyment of the Spit by the thousands who go there each year to enjoy the tranquillity of a car-free wilderness and it will have a very damaging effect on birds, particularly during migration.

We have enclosed a petition, which we urge you to sign and circulate to friends and neighbours. This is an extremely important issue for all of us who love our waterfront.
